abrdn Sterling Short Term Government Bond Fund, a Sterling denominated sub fund of the abrdn OEIC I, I Acc Shares (ISIN: GB00BWK25K43). This fund is managed by abrdn Fund Managers Limited.

OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

Investment Objective

To generate income and some growth over the medium to long term (3 to 5 years) by investing in UK Government bonds with a maturity of up to five years.

Performance Target: To achieve the return of the FTSE Actuaries UK Conventional Gilts (1-5 Years) Index plus 0.5% per annum (before charges). There is no certainty or promise that the Performance Target will be achieved.

The FTSE Actuaries UK Conventional Gilts (1-5 Years) Index (the "Index") is a representative index of the market for ÙK Government bonds with a maturity of up to 5 years.

Investment Policy

Portfolio Securities

- The fund invests at least 80% in government bonds (which are like loans to governments that pay interest) issued or guaranteed by the UK Government with a maturity of up to 5 years.

- The fund may also invest in other bonds (including those issued by government-related bodies and corporations) of any maturity, issued anywhere in the world. The fund will employ techniques to reduce (hedge) risk related to currency movements on non-Sterling bonds. - The fund may also invest in other funds (including those managed by abrdn), cash and assets that can be turned into cash quickly.

Management Process

- The management team use their discretion (active management) to identify investments based on analysis of global economics along with analysis of an investment's prospects and creditworthiness (debt repayment ability) compared to that of the market. - Due to the fund's risk constraints the fund's performance is not expected to deviate significantly from that of the Index over the long

term.

Derivatives and Techniques

 The fund will make routine use of derivatives to reduce risk to reduce cost and/ or generate extra income or growth consistent with the risk profile of the fund.


